

WE:

- Denounce on an international level the systematic violation of human rights in Mexico.
- 2. Denounce the billions of dollars in aid by the U.S. through *Plan Mérida* and *Plan Triángulo del Norte for the Prosperity of Central America*.
- 3. Denounce the arbitrary detention of community leaders and defenders of human rights, and demand their freedom from government prisons.
- 4. Demand the appearance of the 43 students of Ayotzinapa and the thousands of others who are disappeared throughout Mexico.
- 5. Put a call out to all citizens, community organizations, and collectives outside of Mexico demanding that through their mobilization and solidarity, they demand that the United States, stop financing repressive governments and eliminate Plan Mérida and Plan Triángulo del Norte and the Transpacific-Partnership (TTP).
- 6. Demand the implementation of the Leahy Law because of the systematic violation of human rights in Mexico.

BACKGROUND:

The process of 34 years of neoliberalism and institutional violence practiced by the state by their violent seizing of ancestral lands and natural resources against peoples who resist the imposition of commercial agreements, have caused:

- A. The displacement of thousands of families utilizing the War against Drugs as a cover,
- B. The arbitrary detention and imprisonment of defenders of the environment and community leaders,
- The forced disappearance, the massive and selective murder of young people, and community leaders and,
- D. The generalized homicides of women throughout Mexican territory under the pretext of the false War against Drugs, based on the model of War of Low Intensity (GBI), a product of the School of the Americas, where it is understood that any citizen or peoples who resist the impositions of neoliberal governments are automatically considered enemies of the state.
