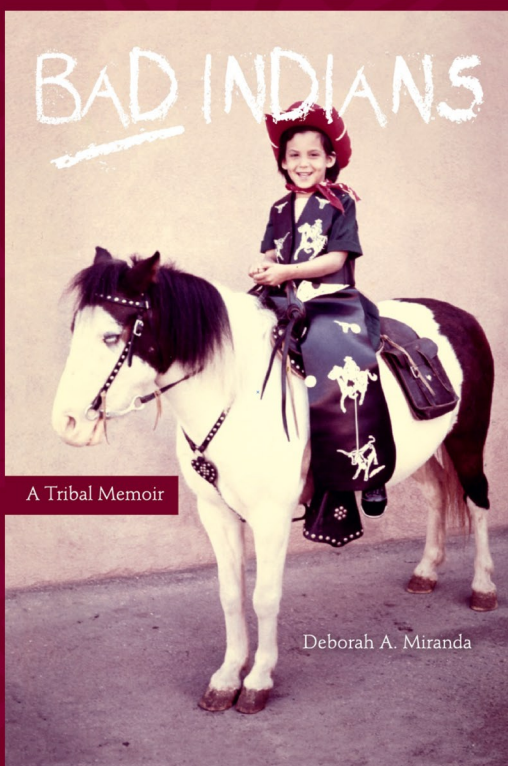


Guest Lecture by Professor Deborah Miranda
